

CARING FOR COLORADO FOUNDATION, DENVER, CO

The Caring for Colorado Foundation received Legacy support to expand an existing provider training and education program targeting health care providers in rural communities to promote and increase tobacco interventions between providers and their patients and the use of QuitLine and QuitNet services in rural areas.

HEALTHCARE GEORGIA FOUNDATION (HGC), ATLANTA, GA

The Healthcare Georgia Foundation received Legacy support for the development of the Georgia Tobacco Policy Project. The project convened public health, policy, research, academic, and economic stakeholders to consider tobacco control policies related to indoor clean air programs, adult smoking cessation, youth tobacco use prevention and the economic impact of reductions in tobacco production; and monitoring the state's use of MSA funds.

NEW MEXICO COMMUNITY FOUNDATION, SANTE FE, NM

The New Mexico Community Foundation received Legacy support for the design and implementation of a state-wide tobacco use prevention initiative conducted through school-based health centers and targeting New Mexico's Native American youth. The project focused on three core activities: grants to school-based health centers; grants to non-profit organizations to train Native American youth on media literacy and a grant for staff.

SUNFLOWER FOUNDATION, TOPEKA, KS

The Sunflower Foundation collaborated with the Kansas Department of Health and Environment and Tobacco Free Kansas Coalition, the Sunflower Foundation developed a community grants program to support the existing infrastructure of community coalitions, youth engagement activities and other related tobacco control efforts that had been established throughout the state.
